Lets review the month of June, the W1NPP Field Day was cancelled due to lack of interest, No one wanted to volunteer to set up a team for the stations, So after talking with Bill, N1KAT, Dave, WE1U it was decided to cancel the FD.

The ARES/RACES Nets are starting to have more people checking in, but our monthly ARES Meeting at EMA office was canceled due a personal issue at home with Tim. We had the quarterly Hospital Test on June 20th. and had both of our hospitals manned. The following Wednesday I attended a Shelter survey of Poland RHS. MEMA is reviewing all shelter in the state of Maine this summer. We will be visiting both Lewiston HS and Park Ave school as well.



As a result of the Poland RHS review, I received a request from Androscoggin Unified

EMA to get a list of Antennas, Coax, Mast, Connectors, and other items to install on the roof at these shelter sites. The county now has 6ea Tribanders (6, 2 and 440), and support equipment to install in the six shelters in Androscoggin. We hope to start installing them in August.

So far in July, the ARES/RACES net we have started to work with FLdigi software. The goal is to gain experience to be able to use it from remote sites (shelters, EMA, etc.). We hope to have a drill and test out the FLdigi.
