July was a busy and productive month. On July 11 we installed the Comet GP-15 tri-bander at Poland Regional High School. Besides myself, Bill, N1KAT, Fred WA1SKP, and Tim AA1UT worked to install the Antenna. Than the weekend of July 13, 14, the club 440 Repeater was back on the air, check it out on 442.000 Mhz with no PL Tone. A member suggested that the ARES/RACES Net be changed to the 442.000 club repeater on Thursday evening. I will bring that up at the August club meeting for discussion The lastest on the D-Star project, one of the TX's have a problem, so Pete, N1ZRL is working on preparing another radio, more info later.



Than on July 24, we returned to Poland RHS to have a Antenna test on all three bands, 6M, 2m, and 440 frequencies. We have a Red Cross Yaseu FT100(HF, VHF and UHF) that will be use for the shelters and was used for this test. The following club members participated Tim, AA1UT at the EMA, Fred, WA1SKP at his home in Mc Falls, Jerry, K1WTX at his home in Turner, John, N1JD at his home in Lisbon Falls, Dave, WE1U in his home in Auburn, than at Poland RHS myself, N1OXA, Bill, N1KAT and Dave N1OXE. The meeting was called to order by Vice President David Lowe we1u at 7:01 p.m. Jerry k1wtx made a motion to accept the Secretarys' report as printed in the ACORN. Chuck kb1zmx seconded the motion. Vote: approved.

Ivan n1oxa and John n1jd will be at the IARU competition Sunday July 7th in Massachusetts in preparation for next years bigger WRTC competition.

David we1u reports that there were six adults and two kids at the June weather spotter class in Auburn. At the test session 3 hams past the General at VE Exams including 2 from club Dakota KB1YYC Al KB1ZLV Dakota's Dad.

Jerry k1wtx told us of the Radio Adventures of Maine Height of Land trip on June 16.

At show and tell time an APRS tracker, a VX-8G hand held radio with built in APRS tracker were passed around along with the new simplex repeater / voice recorder ADS-SR1.

Ivan talked about the planned search and rescue at Beaver Park in Lisbon. A CERT crew of nine showed up June 29th for the outing.

Ivan told of a new MOU Cumberland County ARES signed with MEMA so in case of deployment the ARES members will be covered by MEMAs' insurance. A plan is in the works to get all the counties to sign a similar MOU in the future. Also the next ARES meeting is July 17.

In new business, the Dstar project is coming along slowly and the "cans" for the 440 radio are still out for tuning.

Bob w1ltx and Lee w1lwt have been working on a special events station N1A August 17 in Portsmouth NH to remember the USS Albacore. The hf frequency will be 14.260 Saturday the 17th and on the kq1l link Sunday August 18. Check www.k1aom.us for details.

Also Lee announced that July 15 is the target date for a new repeater to come on from his house in Lisbon on 223.900 out / 222.300 input. Also a 900 MHz repeater is coming soon, details in the near future.

The group talked about the FLdigi system and its latest software updates.

Bob w1ltx reports hearing "noise" on several hf bands, possible causes were discussed.

David we1u proposed the club purchase, give and install Lightning Arrestors and a Coax Switch at the EMA. David reported we have two Grounding Blocks that he built and installed at his expense. EMAs' funding is limited and being cut back further. More than \$1500 of Ham equipment is without lightning arrestors Yaesu FT-897 and the Kenwood TM-D710 not to mention the operators and computer connected. David suggested waiting till next months meeting for a vote. Andy and Jerry voiced opinions that the EMA should provide the parts and David agreed, but see the provision of protection now a priority. Ken N1DOT suggested a letter explaining to the EMA and their funding source the state of things and the need for parts, David also agreed and expects the cost of about \$700 for 6 lightning arrestors, grounding strip, #4 wire and coax switch.

Bob w1ltx made a motion to adjourn with a second from Andy kb1doi. Vote: approved at 8:11 p.m. After the meeting David we1u did a presentation about APRS. Also Ivan raffled off map from the ARRL.
