

On Wed the 11th, they want to do a radio check with the hospitals but a time has not yet been established for that. Then at 6 p.m. they want to do a radio exercise over amateur radio trying connections through the linked system and other local repeaters, as well as using HF. This can be done from home or at the EOC or both. The idea is to see how the National Guard could use amateur radio to relay messages during an extensive disaster where all other lines of communication are impaired. Secretary's Report

The Androscoggin Amateur Radio Club held a meeting Wednesday August 7, 2013 at 7 p.m. at the Potvin Room at St. Marys Medical Arts Building in Lewiston Maine. In attendance: kb1zmx, wa1skp, kb1doi, n1oxe, n1jd, w1scm and son Charles, n1kat, n1oxa, n1nyw, kb1zlb and xyl, kb1yyc, n1dot, kb1cdu, k6pij, ku1u at the meeting for a few minutes, w1ltx, w1lwt and k1wtx.

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Woodhead n1kat at 7:00 p.m. Bob w1ltx made a motion to approve the Secretarys' report as written in the ACORN. Seconded by kb1doi. Vote: approved.

Ivan read the Treasurers report and kb1doi made a motion to approve the report with a second from k6pij. Vote: approved.

Ivan reported that the antenna was installed and tested at the Poland Regional High School. Good reception was reported by an number of hams. The next antenna to go up should be at the Park Avenue Elementary in Auburn. The Red Cross will have an FT-100 ready at the EMA in a ready kit to take to one of the school and plug in and use.

The 146.610 repeater is out of service. Just before this meeting Ivan and technician Tom Poto checked the repeater and pronounced the power amplifier dead. Tom will check to see what spare parts he has to fix it and recommended buying spare repeaters from the government agencies who have removed theirs to either switch to narrow band or digital.

The shack the 146.610 repeater is housed in is in bad repair and needs replacement or major repairs. It has been designated as a historic site so it may not be easy to fix or replace without lots of paper work. Stay tuned.

Ivan reports the next public service events with be Loon Echo and the Dempsey Challenge. The SET has been moved to November, more to come in the future.

Lee w1lwt talked about the special events station n1a at the USS Albacore on August 24 and 25. Also Lee says that the new Lisbon repeater on 223.900 will be ready for service soon and will be linked so there will be coverage on the 220 band from Bangor to the Portland area.

Ivan explained that he would like to put together a team from Maine to help set up and tear down the sixty five stations at next years WRTC in Mass. Contact Ivan for details and / or to sign up.

At one of the next meetings we hope to have Tom Poto talk about the Coast Guards GPS Automatic Location System. We don't know which meeting yet.

Dave n1oxe made a motion to adjourn that was seconded by Bob w1ltx. Vote: approved at 7:37 p.m. There was no presentation after the meeting.
