As you read this this the 2014 ARRL Maine State Convention and Hamfest is history and hope you were able to attend. We are planning a Simplex VHF radio test for Androscoggin County on Tuesday April 8 at 1930 on our Primary Freq. of 146.46. So Turn on your HT's or mobiles and check in. If you hear someone trying to check in, than call net control and relay them into the net. When not if we have a major disaster most phones, repeaters both government and amateur will go off line even with back up power. So using simplex will be the only communication for local agencies. We will also do a UHF test in future months.

If you have only one battery pack for your HT, buy a AA battery pack and have extra batteries for back up, a note the AA battery pack will last longer than your rechargeable pack.

And remember to check in to The ARES/RACES net on Thursday evening on 146.61 at 1930 hrs.
