June Secretary's Report By Dick Knight Secretary N1NYW

The Androscoggin Amateur Radio Club held a meeting on June 4, 2014 at the Potvin Room at the St. Marys' Medical arts building in Lewiston Maine. Twenty two members and guests were in attendance including: n1oxa, n1nyw, wt1a and Beth, n1dot, kb1cac, n1wfo, kg1q, wa1skp, kb1qhr, w1ltx, k1wtx, kb1doi, n1zrl, n1oxe, n1jd, n1svb, ve1aws, k0uxb, kc1aih, ke6eij, ku1u.

The Meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. by the Treasurer Ivan n1oxe because the President and Vice President were absent. David n1oxe made a motion to approve the Secretarys' report as written in the ACORN. The motion was seconded by Andy kb1doi. Vote: approved.

Ivan read the Treasurers report. John n1jd made a motion to approve the report. Bob w1ltx seconded the report. Vote: approved.

At this point Vice President Cory ku1u arrived and presided over the meeting. Cory reports that the DSTAR repeater project is coming along and he has applied for the frequency of 443.3 for the DSTAR repeater. Cory says that the one hundred and forty pound repeater will be tested a Pete n1zrls' house before it goes up to its' spot on the hill. Cory says he hopes it will be operational in July.

Tim wt1a reported on Field Day plans at the Poland Spring Inn and Resort. Tim told how Beth will be taking charge of the food and hospitality. He showed a power point presentation showing a map of the location and explained where everything will be set up, the times of operation and that we have a special call sign k1p. Point total should be higher because Tim has invited Poland town officials to attend. Tim also mentioned later in the meeting that the WRTC is coming to Mass. this summer and volunteers are needed for many jobs.

Cory ku1u says the club got an invitation to operate at the Lisbon Fish and Game starting around 11 a.m. on June 14th.. Cory also reports that a new question pool will take effect on July first for the tech test.

Cory asked me to look into getting the .61 repeater listing changed to analog and digital because the day before the meeting the new DR-1 System Fusion repeater from Yaesu arrived and was programmed and tested. I will start that update process as soon as this report is finished. The club is beta testing the repeater, a mobile rig and ht that transmit and receive digital signals or analog. There will be little effect on current users. You can continue to use your radios as usual. The repeater should hear your signal in analog and retransmit it in analog just like the repeaters always have without your radio sending a pl tone. The digital mobile and ht supplied should change the repeater to digital mode automatically. If you hear the digital noise and get tired of hearing it get out the instruction book for you radio and program in a 100hz tone on the receiver. With the tone on the receiver your radio will open the squelch when it hears analog but not let you hear the digital noise. Note: this new repeater does not have a courtesy beep. We are beta testing the System Fusion that means Yaesu wants to know what you think of it. We have to send them reports so for the next three months. Send emails about your experience good or bad with the System Fusion to dickknight@gmail.com and I will forward them to Yaeau.

W1ltx suggested the club send Paul kb1qhrs' mother a get well card because she is in the hospital. This will be done.

Earle w1svb made a motion to adjourn. Approved at 8:05 p.m.
