A meeting of the Androscoggin Amateur Radio Club was held August 6, 2014 at the Potvin Room at the St. Marys' Medical Arts Building in Lewiston Maine. In attendance: kb1cdu, n1dot, w1ltx, w1lwt, wt1a, wa1skp, kb1doi, n1jd, wa1eoj, kc1aih, n1oxa, n1nyw, kb1yyc, n1vlz.

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Cory ku1u at 7:00 p.m. Bob w1ltx made a motion to accept the Secretarys' report that was seconded by Andy kb1doi. Vote: Approved.

Ivan read the Treasurers report. Andy kb1doi made a motion to accept the report as read, seconded by Bob w1ltx. Vote: approved.

Old business: Dick n1nyw mentioned that at last months meeting Tim wt1a was asked at Field Day if he Andy Club would be interested in operating the .315 repeater in Poland. Tim says he has not heard from them about it since Field Day. We will wait until we find out how much the rent is and how much money they want for it before making a decision.

Ivan is getting ready for the 88.5 PL tone to be turned on Friday August 8 on the 146.61 repeater. The Yaesu support person recommended the repeater be reset. It may help to avoid future problems with the receiver sensitivity.

The Dstar repeater board talked about last meeting was purchased and has been installed. After the crew gets done putting the PL tone on the .61 Friday they will measure for a new coax and get new connectors and other stuff for the Dstar repeater.

Having a picnic was discussed again. The list of possible locations have been narrowed down to Pettingill Park in Auburn and Beaver Park in Lisbon but no picnic has been scheduled yet.

Andy kb1doi has got the Special Events station call sign already for the Dempsey Challenge and is getting it included in the special event section of QST. He has three operators already signed up and would like to have more. Contact Andy and let him know you want to operate.

Cory reports that there is a new ARRL Section Manager now and lots of changes to the appointed positions.

Fred inquired about the time table to get antenna and feed line into the schools that do not have it installed yet. If would be good to get the project done in the summer before the students return.

I reported that the web page view counter service Reliable Counter on the club site to count the number of computers that visited the site was getting less reliable and changed to a different service. Also I got a call from Dave Hawke kq1l who is our web site host. He has installed solar panels at his house and is cutting the electric demands and is shutting down the server that hosts a website we have a link to on w1npp.org and had me change the link so it will go to a different server. Dave also asked a question I did not know the answer to. When is the next Yankee Club meeting?

Ivan reports that he and Bill pulled the coax out of the old Red Cross building and will have to go up on the roof and take the antenna off and move the antennas and coax to the new building. Tim wt1u reports there is still work to be done to get antennas and feed line into all the Red Cross shelters in the county.

Cory asked the status of VE exams scheduled in the future. It was decided October might be a good time but a date was not set.
