The meeting was called to order at 7:30 after we had all the food the members brought in for the Christmas meal. Ivan passed on a letter to the club from the ARRL Foundation that the \$1000 scholarship from the Androscoggin Club was returned to the Foundation because the winner did not enroll in college this fall. The money will be used for a Scholarship next year.

Tim reminded us that the state convention is coming up in just a few months and it is on Easter weekend this

year. HRO has not committed to be at the convention because of the shortage of credit card equipment. Work will continue to get the issue resolved.

Talk of having a class or seminar for new hams who need an "Elmer" to help them with the transition into the hobby after they get their license. No date and time were scheduled yet.

A VE exam session will be held January 27 at 7 p.m. at the Potvin Room 99 Campus Avenue in Lewiston, the same room the club meetings are held. Contact person is Ivan.
