Hurricane season has been especially active the year, and HAMs have stepped up to provide communication in and out of the affected areas. Many stories are out there and most have a common theme; people are very grateful to hear word from the their loved ones. Welfare messages have been passed both formally and informally with similar results and success. Informal message traffic has benefited from the experience of operators with formal message handling skills. This is an important area for us to continue working on and expand on. Puerto Rico has been the most recent target of these activities and without power or commercial communications, Amateur Radio has been the sole source of communication in and out of the area.

The Fire and Ice statewide exercise went well for the most part. HF is still a very elusive area for our NVIS operations to Augusta. Apparently we were not the only ones having trouble in that area. That being so consistent, we may need to look for an alternate approach to how we handle this from the EOC. Simplex worked very well, as did relaying of information to stations outside the range of the EOC. Thank you to Miriam/KC1AIH, Deb/KB1DEB, David/WE1EU. Ivan/N1OXA, Clint/KB1YPZ, and Pete/N1ZRL for their time and participation. I'd also like to thank the Androscoggin UEMA for their inclusion of ARES/RACES in this event and their continued support of our efforts.

The planned fourth part of this exercise has been reduced to a tabletop exercise for the local agencies, and will not include ARES/RACES. Fortunately, we have an upcoming ARRL Simulated Emergency Test (SET) in October with no clear scenario. Expect the October SET to be a continuation of the Fire and Ice exercise for the purpose of allowing us to expand on things we need to work on. Date is Saturday October 28, time to be announced but will likely be in the morning hours.

The Dempsey Challenge is Sunday October 8 and still needs operators for water stations and SAG vehicles. Contact Ivan/N1OXA to find out more and sign up for this event.

The temperature is swinging wildly over the past few weeks, but the trend is cooling (even though some days seem quite warm). Winter is trying to get a

foothold, so it's time to start finishing up those Summer projects and changing the Go-Kits to Winter.
