Field Day has come and gone, only the memories remain, thank goodness.


It could have left two of us attending with water damaged equipment!

Two incidents occurred, Tim WT1A, had a leak in his canopy/tent that drip on his radio but, he quickly covered the unit with a drop cloth and proceeded to "repair" the problem spot on the canopy/tent

My setup, in the back of the Nissan, hatch up, covered by a canopy that extended over the roof of the Nissan, by about 24", the canopy had collected water, in deep puddles on all four sides. Rick, W1FO, pushed up on the far side, from the Nissan, I pushed up on the side over lapping the vehicle, not a good move on my part.

The water hit the roof of the Nissan and proceeded to inside the open gap between the roof and hatch, the wireless keyboard taking a direct hit, water splashing on the the FT-857D and equipment, mounted in the Gator rack. I instantly pulled the Anderson Power Poles feeding the rack for the Battery enclosure (Battery enclosure was not a concern, was well protected).

We, Rick and I were going to get ready for a satellite contact, path was very good looking too, Darn it. Now we went into damage control mode. Rick retrieved a Power Ranger towel and another unmarked one, I Removed batteries from the wireless keyboard tapped gently on the floor of the Nissan's hatchback floor, set it aside, upside down, to help with drainage. Jason pointed out something that I won't get into here, (concerns CPU clock setting:) But, just to be able to "Attempt" to get through and try, was a great time and to have recovered from a "Near Hit" of the H O 2 kind,

well... a good wet time was had by all. Let's do this again! Without the water works.
