In attendance: kc1aih, kb1ypz, ac1ae, kb1doi, n1oxa, n1nyw, n1wfo, kc1bep, wa1skp, n1vlz, w1lwt, w1ltx, wt1a, wb1hfv, kb1ghr, k1wtx, n1jd, Dale Austin passed his test at the convention and is waiting for his call sign, and w7vx.

The meeting was called to order at 6:58 p.m. by President Tim Bubier wt1a. Miriam kc1aih made a motion to approve the minutes of the March meeting. The motion was seconded by John kc1bep. Vote: approved.

Ivan gave the Treasurers Report including information about the hamfest and the money raised from the 308 persons attending. Ivan also reports that the CD for the scholarship earned \$ 74 interest. After next years convention we may need to add more money to the fund if someone wins the scholarship. No one won last year so the money remained in the CD. Ivan will make sure that the clubs credit Bissau; FG4KH, Guadeloupe; HP9SAM; Panama; Z60A, card is charged for the correct prize for the convention because the first one ordered was not available.

The tower climber was at the convention. Tim talked to him, he should be able to get to our tower job(s) in May. It was reported that the Auburn police and fire radios will be moved from the Gracelawn road tower to the Goff Hill tower soon so there will be more room for our equipment at the Gracelawn tower. Also the Poland repeater will be checked for possible interference. Tim said he thinks that the linking of the DSTAR repeater and the .61 wire-x system can be done from the EMA office once the repeaters are installed in the permanent locations.

Jerry reported that a few people had problems with the Ramada with the restaurant and rooms. Hamfest suggestion: start the talks earlier so no one will miss the prize drawings.

The VE session at the convention had 12 new techs 6 general and 4 extra. The news from the ARRL is that there are 378 thousand people with tech licenses and the league is proposing adding more privileges on HF for the techs.

Election of officers: Tim asked for nominations so Bob w1ltx nominated Lee w1lwt for President, at the same time Miriam kc1aih made a motion to re-elect the current officers month. For later additions visit NG3K web page. for another term with a second from Walter ac1ae.
