President Notes by Tim Bubier

We've had a lot of activity on the repeater front this past couple of weeks. We had a work party at my home on the 11th and got a lot of work done preparing my tilt overcrank up tower. Unfortunately, we failed to get it vertical that day but I did manage to get it corrected and upright a couple of days later. Now the 146.895 repeater is back on the air with the base of the antenna about 55 feet above the ground.

Then on the 19th, a small group of us met on White Oak Hill in Poland to replace the cables on the .315 machine and get a PolyPhaser in place on the feedline. We had mixed success there, replacing the lines between the repeater and the duplexer, inserting the PolyPhaser and new line from the duplexer to it at the base of the tower, identifying a shorted connection at the base of the tower and repairing it, but we were unable to replace the feed line from the PolyPhaser to the antenna because of our inability to lower the tower enough to access the antenna. The end result was a lowering of the SWR to the repeater but the logistics of reaching the antenna will still have to be addressed.

The .610 repeater will also be getting some attention with a new feed line planned for this week as well. So, overall, much-needed work has been done to all three 2 meter repeaters. Thanks to all those who volunteered their time to do so.

As we get to the end of our summer, I hope that everyone has enjoyed the outdoors and got things prepared for the coming cold season. As always, if you have work around your place that needs to be done, please let us know so we can help.

Poland Repeater Cable Replacement Project, Sunday August 19.

Cables inside cabinet and to the Poly-Phase lightening protector (outside on antenna base) were replaced. The cable from base of tower to antenna, (Poly-Phase to antenna) was not, deemed as not safe to access by the climber. (He's the climber, his call) to the disappointment of some of us. Best to be safe than risk an accident. Replacement of this cable will be addressed at a later date.

A one bad connector was discovered on the cable that did not get replaced (Poly-Phase end of the existing cable). The connector was replaced. Jerry K1WTX did a wonderful job assembling together an N-type connector of coax and so did Tim W1TA.

There are some procedures/methods, in the fraternity of Amateur radio operators that are reserved for those who have achieved certain level of degrees, within the brotherhood, and must remain a secret, within our society. (HI HI!)
