This is great news for the DX community as it will allow a larger range of Hams to make an ATNO (All Time New One). They will be signing as E51DOM/MM to and from the island. They departed on March 19 and are expected to arrive around March 26. Landing will take place using zodiacs. 3Y/B is ranked #2 on Club log's DXCC most wanted.
