The rebels have released a statement of their second attempt on Bouvet



Lets hope they are able to land on this attempt.


Takeoff angle and dxing

It is often written that a low takeoff angle (TOA) is good for dxing, and high takeoff angle is good for close in regional work. Vertical antennas have a very low TOA, with it highest gain numbers around 15 degrees which is ideal for long haul dxing. For comparison, a dipole at 1/3 wavelength would typically have its highest gain figures at a TOA of 50 degrees.

This graph below represents a typically pattern for a horizontal dipole. Notice its max gain is 6.6dbi, at an angle of 54 degrees. Notice, down at an angle of 15 degree that the gain is only 0.42 dbi gain.



This next graph represents a typical pattern for a vertical. Notice it only has a max gain of 2.21 dbi, at an angle of 19 degrees. However, down at 15 degrees, is still has a gain of 2.1 dbi.
